# Featured Festival Personnel

Charles Allen, a retired Professor of Biology from the University of Louisiana at Monroe and also a retired botanist from Ft. Polk, is a charter member & past president of the Louisiana Native Plant Society. He is the co-author of several books, the latest being *Louisiana Wildflower Guide*. He and his wife Susan operate Allen Acres B&B, a nature-oriented paradise. Allen Acres is a haven for butterflies, moths, and hummingbirds as well as other birds and wildflowers. Many events focusing on nature are scheduled there annually.
